### Ofsted Inspection – October 2017: GOOD in all areas

We may have been judged as "GOOD" by Ofsted and not as AWESOME but that is pretty much the way that everyone here at Stapleford Primary is feeling at the moment!!

Wow! What a term we have had so far!! It seems just like yesterday that we returned from our summer holidays but already the pupils have celebrated the harvest, enjoyed a residential trip, visited Hertford theatre, participated in a roller skating workshop, interviewed a World War II evacuee, experienced a day in the life of a private jet pilot, completed essential first aid training and a sponsored skip, held a service of remembrance, enjoyed bonfire night and punched above our weight in some fantastic football and netball fixtures. Phew!!

We have hardly had time to take a breath. In fact when Ofsted rang up to say they were coming to complete their inspection my first reaction was "We are too busy. How are we going to fit them in?" We did, of course, make time for them and we are very proud of the inpsection report they wrote about our delightful little school. The whole process felt like continued professional development and as a consquence there is a real buzz about the school as everyone strives to achieve our next steps and improve our provision still further. Huge thanks must go to the the staff and governors for all of their hard work, to the parents for their continued support (96% said they would recommend the school – a truly amazing figure) and finally to the pupils who never ever let us down. ### **eSafety**

Internet safety advice is directly applicable to the gaming environment because of the risks that are present. It is essential that children are aware of these issues and are given the skills and knowledge to help manage and reduce these risks, with the help of those around them.

# What are the risks of online games?

- Children may view inappropriate or upsetting content if they play games that aren't suitable for their age. This could include sexual or violent material. It might be in-game content or produced by other players.
- Some players can be abusive towards others or try to exlude them from the game. Some players may also hack another user's account or try to steal and destroy their virtual possessions. This can be as upsetting for a young person as if it happened in real life.
- Children may play with adults they don't know. People of all ages play games. Some
  adults may exploit this and try to build an emotional connection with a child for the purpose
  of grooming.
- Some children may find it hard to stop playing games or find that gaming is getting the way of them doing other activities.

## HAVE YOU CLAIMED THE EXTRA FUNDING FOR YOUR CHILD?

### Pupil Premium Funding - IMPORTANT

**Pupil premium** is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to help raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. **This means that YOUR child may be entitled to a quite considerable amount of funding that can be used within school to support their learning.** 

Your child could be eligible for extra funding if you receive any of the following:

**Income Support** 

Income-based Jobseekers Allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)


Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

**Universal Credit.** 

This extra funding can really make a difference to your child's achievements and for that reason we are asking that all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 parents and any parents of older children whose circumstances may have changed register online at www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals.

Please note that children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with free meals. However, this does not mean that you are already registered for the additional funding which is called Pupil Premium. To gain the extra Pupil Premium funding for your child you must register by using the above URL or link. Thank you.

### CHRISTMAS DECORATION DAY


### SAVE THE DATE - 9am Friday 1st December 2017
