<b>Literacy</b> Tasks for the day	<b>Bird research</b> Some birds have come back from migration and some have been busy making nests. Try looking out of a window/door and see if you can hear any birds.  Research the names of different birds you might find in spring/summer. Make a list of these birds for your Literacy activity tomorrow.	<b>Create a bird word search</b> Using the names of different birds that you have researched can you create a word search with the names. How many can you hide in your word search for someone else to find?	<b>Bird Nest Baking:</b> <b>Create your own edible nest</b> Find a recipe for Chocolate nest cakes online.  Check that you have all of the ingredients at home and then can you follow the instructions step by step to make your nest cakes.  Remember to wash your hands!  Looking forward to seeing the photos.	<b>Create a fly away story:</b> Birds migrate in the winter months to warmer climates. You can research which birds migrate by looking online or in books. Get imagining and think about where you would like to migrate to if you could and write a story about where you go, what you see and what happens.	<b>Make a bird box or a bird feeder.</b> There are some great instructions from the RSPB about how to make a safe bird feeder, so have a look online and see if you can make a safe bird feeder, so have a look online and see if you can make a feeder that will bring birds flocking to your garden or outside space.

Daily reading (30 minutes)  Daily exercise (30 minutes)	<b>RE Task</b> <b>Big question:</b> What does the dove represent in the bible?  + Daily reading (30 minutes)  Daily exercise (30 minutes)	<b>Geography Task</b> <b>Bird watch:</b> Take a look out of your window/door or even while on your daily walk and see if you can see any birds. Try and identify these birds and write down the names. Over time, create a tally chart of how many times you see different birds. Which bird is the most common where you live?  + Daily reading (30 minutes)  Daily exercise (30 minutes)

### Summer Term Plans

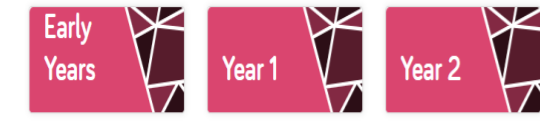
