Literacy Tasks for the day	Bird research Some birds have come back from migration and some have been busy making nests. Try looking out of a window/door and see if you can hear any birds. Research the names of different birds you might find in spring/summer. Make a list of these birds for your Literacy activity tomorrow.	Create a bird word search Using the names of different birds that you have researched can you create a word search with the names. How many can you hide in your word search for someone else to find?	Bird Nest Baking: Create your own edible nest Find a recipe for Chocolate nest cakes online. Check that you have all of the ingredients at home and then can you follow the instructions step by step to make your nest cakes. Remember to wash your hands! Looking forward to seeing the photos.	Create a fly away story: Birds migrate in the winter months to warmer climates. You can research which birds migrate by looking online or in books. Get imagining and think about where you would like to migrate to if you could and write a story about where you go, what you see and what happens.	Make a bird box or a bird feeder.
