How are rainbows created? Rainbows are common in Spring when the sun is low in the sky and we get a lot of rain! Now can you research how they are formed?

Rainbow Spaghetti

INGREDIENTS

6 food bags 1 lb. spaghetti, cooked Food colouring (we used 6) 1 c. water, divided 3 tbsp. butter, melted 1/3 c. freshly grated Parmesan salt Freshly ground black pepper

INSTUCTIONS

- 1. Place 2 tbsp water into each food bags back (we used 6 for 6 different colours).
- 2. Add 10 drops gel food colouring to each bag.
- 3. Divide the spaghetti into the 6 different bags.
- 4. Shake until they are coated in their colours.
- 5. Remove each pasta individually from food bag and rinse with cold water.
- 6. Combine in a large bowl and toss together with butter and parm.
- 7. Season with salt and pepper and serve.
