We have all been working throughout this pandemic but it is only now that all children are back in their classrooms that it feels like the Stapleford Primary School we know and love.

In order to open we have had to follow many guidelines and put numerous measures in place to keep everyone safe. These were communicated to you earlier in September. I am pleased to report that apart from the odd tweak here and there the plan has worked extremely well. The staff have been amazing and the children have adapted very quickly to their new arrival times, entrances, hand washing regimes etc. Our attendance is currently higher than in previous years at this time which is also great to see.

Your children have already been away from school for too long so moving forward we must protect our entire school community as best we can. People will become ill with non-Covid-19 related illnesses throughout the year and with maximising learning time in mind please do not send your child into school, where they can pass it on, if they are unwell. Please do not simply administer a dose of Calpol and think that it is OK to send your child into school.

If anyone at school becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, or has a loss of, or change in their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), they will be sent home and be advised to follow the guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. This sets out that they must:

- self-isolate
- arrange to have a test to see if they have coronavirus (COVID-19)

Please do not send your child to school if they are displaying any of the symptoms above.



I will look forward to a time when we can relax some of our precautionary measures and return the school to normality by holding Class Assemblies etc. In the meantime, I would like to thank you all for your sensible and patient approach towards our recent reopening.

Pupil Premium Funding - IMPORTANT

Pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to help raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. This means that YOUR child may be entitled to a quite considerable amount of funding that can be used within school to support their learning.

Your child could be eligible for extra funding if you receive any of the following:

Income Support
Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year) **Working Tax Credit run-on** (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit) **Universal Credit.**

This extra funding can really make a difference to your child's achievements and for that reason we are asking that all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 parents and any parents of older children whose circumstances may have changed register online at www.hertsdirect.org/freeschoolmeals.

Please note that children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are provided with free meals. However, this does not mean that you are already registered for the additional funding which is called Pupil Premium. To gain the extra Pupil Premium funding for your child you must register by using the above URL or link. Thank you.
