

SAFEGUARDING: How is it taught at Stapleford Primary School?

Safeguarding is evident throughout our curriculum.

Examples of how we teach pupils to stay safe include:

- Bikeability level 1 & 2 training
- NSPCC PANTS lessons for all age groups
- Internet Safety Day
- How to stay safe online
- Beach and water safety assembly each summer
- Firework safety lessons and assembly
- eSafety monthly newsletter item
- eSafety Herts for Learning termly updates sent to staff and pupils
- Children made aware of safeguarding and child protection posters around school e.g.
 Childline and who is the Designated Safeguarding Lead etc.
- COVID-19 safety taught in class and assemblies
- Sex and relationships education covers respect and consent
- "STOP IT! I don't like it!" is taught as a phrase to use to all children from Nursery 2 upwards.
- Healthy eating is promoted
- Keeping fit is promoted e.g. Free post lockdown fitness clubs and daily mile
- Warming up before exercise is taught.
- Road safety
- People who help us and how to contact them e.g. police, fire brigade, ambulance, RLNI,
 coastguard
- Where do you live? Knowing your address and what to do if you get lost.
- Stranger danger
- Safety in the home
- Protective behaviours
- Electrical safety
- Swimming How to swim and self-rescue
- Telling and adult
