Class 1

Class Information

- Just like last term, homework will be given on a Friday and returned the following Wednesday. This should be children's own work and they should spend roughly 30 minutes on each piece. Children should ensure it is completed to the best of their ability.
- Daily reading is essential. It is still beneficial to listen to children read at this age, and discussion of texts once children have read really helps their understanding. Reading to your child is also extremely beneficial to their learning even in Years 5 and 6.
- Spellings will be sent home each week ready to be learnt for a test the following week.
- Mental Arithmetic Maths homework will be sent home weekly. Please complete one page each week.
- Times tables – we will play the Golden 100 Times Tables game each week so don't forget to work on them at home. "Hit the button" is a great web based maths game.
- PE lessons are on Wednesdays and swimming is on Friday. No earrings and suitable footwear please. All PE kit and uniform should be labelled. Please provide your child with a water bottle.
- Please ensure your child has an art shirt/apron in their bag.

Your help in ensuring children have the right resources each day is brilliant. However, as children reach the top of the school a sense of responsibility and independence is even better! It will prove invaluable once they reach secondary school.

Spring Term 2018

Welcome back Class One. I hope you had a calm and peaceful holiday and that you are feeling relaxed and refreshed. We have had a fantastic first week. Thank you to all of the children for working so hard. Keep it up Class One! We've got a busy term coming up. It is full of lots of exciting learning which I'm sure the children will love!

Literacy

In literacy we will be looking at stories with flashbacks, persuasive writing and classic poems.

Maths

Maths will continue to focus on key skills and problem solving. We will also move on to focus on shape and angles, co-ordinates, algebra and area, perimeter and volume. Times tables knowledge will be key to all of this so please help your child to become as confident as possible.

RE

Our RE lessons will be focused on the life of Jesus and our value of the half term, which is courage.

Science

In Science we are going to be learning about Electricity and circuits.

Geography

In Geography we will be improving our map skills and finding out about different time zones.

Class 2:

Class Information

- Homework will be set every Friday and should be returned by the following Wednesday. This will consist of spellings, maths, daily reading and a choice from the homework grid. This half term all of the choices for homework on the grid will continue to be about Skeletons.
- Daily reading is essential. It is still beneficial to listen to children read at this age and discussion of texts once children have read really helps their understanding. It is important to make time to read to your child even in Years 3 and 4. Hearing adults read helps children develop their own reading skills.
- Spellings will be sent home each week ready to be learnt for a test the following week.
- Mental Arithmetic Maths homework will be sent home weekly. Please complete one page each week.
- Times tables – we will play the Golden 100 Times Tables game each week so don't forget to work on them at home. "Hit the button" is a great web based maths game.
- As ever, there will be two sessions of PE per week – can you please ensure all PE kit is present in school, clean and labelled. Children need shorts and a white top for PE, although they may wear blue jogging bottoms if it is cold outside. PE is scheduled to be on a Wednesday and swimming on a Friday. No earrings and suitable footwear please. Please provide your child with a water bottle.
- Please ensure your child has an art shirt/apron in their bag.

Spring Term 2018

We will be covering a range of exciting learning during the Spring Term such as:

- Living Things and their Environment
- Anglo Saxons and the Scots
- Investigating how the environment can change how we feel about a place

Literacy

In literacy we will be learning about myths and legends, fairytales and playscripts, recounts, non-chronological reports and poetry.

Maths

Maths will continue to focus on place value and decimals, mental and written addition and subtraction, measures and data, fractions and decimals, and time, shape and data. Times tables knowledge will be key to all of this, so please help your child to become as fluent and confident as possible.

RE

Our RE lessons will be focused on Sikhism followed by Easter, and our **value of the half term which is courage**.

Science

In Science we are going to be learning about Living thing and their habitats.

History

In History we will be learning all about the Anglo-Saxons and Scots.

Art and Design

We will be learning about how the environment affects how we feel about a place and how art can be used to improve a place.

Music

Year 4 will continue with Wider Opportunities learning to play a stringed instrument. Year 3 will continue to learn how to play the recorder and read

Class Information

- Homework is handed out on a Friday. Homework books must be returned to school on Wednesdays.
- Spellings will be sent out each week and these will be tested on a Friday.
- Please read daily with your child and sign the reading record book.
- Year 1 reading books will be changed Monday, Wednesday and Friday.
- Year 2 reading books will be changed daily.
- Mathematics passwords are inside the cover of your child's reading record, please encourage your child to log onto Mathematics at least once a week.
- PE days are Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Please can you ensure PE kit is in school on these days. No earrings and suitable footwear please.
- All PE kit and uniform should be labelled.
- Please provide your child with a water bottle. This will be sent home daily.

Spring Term 2018

Literacy

We will be looking at fictional stories with familiar settings, stories involving fantasy. We will also be developing our rhyming skills and learn all about silly poems with pattern and rhyme. Through creating posters, lists and signs, the children will learn about parts of non-fiction texts.

Maths

We will be learning about:

Recognising, ordering, comparing numbers.

Place value.

Adding and subtracting,

Counting on and back in one's, two's and ten's

Handling data – Using tables and lists.

Measures – Finding the difference in length

Shape – Looking closely at 3D shapes, position and symmetry

Time – Days of the week and months, reading the time to the hour, half hour and quarter intervals.

RE

Children will be learning about special places and sacred places. They will be looking at places of worship and what Christians do when they go to church. They will also be learning the Easter story and looking at the significance of the Easter. **Our value of the half term is courage.**

Science

Children will be learning about living things and their habitats. Children will learn to explore and compare the differences between living and non-living things by thinking about life processes. They will then begin to identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, by mapping a habitat and identifying its inhabitants.

History

This term in children will be learning about Florence Nightingale and The Crimean War. Children will begin to develop an awareness of the past and have the opportunity to learn why Florence was a significant individuals and what she did.

Geography

Children will be learning to name and locate countries, continents and oceans on a map and identify hot and cold places in the world. They will look at the physical geography of each and why certain countries are hot or cold.

Design and Technology

Children will be busy cooking and using the basic principles of a healthy and varied diet to prepare dishes.

Art

Linked to our history topic, children will be drawing images of Florence Nightingale. They will also be learning about the artist Leonardo da Vinci and drawing self-portraits using pencil and line shading in his style.

Class Information

Class 4 is a mix of Nursery and Reception children. The Nursery children go home at 11.45am or they can go to the lunch club until 12.45pm. Reception Class finishes at 2.55 pm.

We passionately follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. Much of the teaching and learning is completed through Play Based and Child Initiated activities. Taking the children's interests as a starting point, teachers and practitioners will plan a variety of activities designed to develop and extend children's learning and understanding.

Children's learning is recorded in individual Learning Journals, which include photographs, observations, and samples of work, both independent and teacher led. Parents are encouraged to contribute and share in these Journals and do this through sending in 'News from Home'. The children love to stand up and confidently talk about what they have learned from home with their peers.

At Stapleford Primary School we acknowledge the expertise of parents in relation to their children and strive to work closely with them. For some children, Nursery or Reception will be their first experience of school and being away from home. With this in mind, our aim is to make this as pleasurable and stress free as possible, for both the children and the parents. We provide a warm, inviting environment for learning and activities are planned carefully to provide a positive context for learning and teaching, both indoors and outdoors. Staff are available to talk to parents at the start and end of the day.

Other information and reminders:

- Reception children will change their library book on a Friday.
- Reception children will receive a reading book and a homework pack every Friday. Please bring this into school by the following Wednesday.
- PE is on Wednesday: please ensure your child has a clean, named PE kit in school.
- Please provide your child with outdoor shoes (old trainers, wellies) and a water bottle.
- Please ensure your child has their book bag in school every day to put in letters, drawings and anything they have made, etc., to take home.

SPRING TERM 2018

Hello to all Nursery and Reception parents and welcome to the Spring Term 2018. We hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable Christmas! We extend a warm welcome to the new children who have joined Nursery and hope you all settle in quickly.
