Just before we broke up for the Easter holidays Class 2 went on their three day residential trip to Hudnall Park. For some of the children this was their first time away without their families. ### Hertford and Ware Music Festival

The Hertford and Ware Music Festival takes place, over three nights every year, during the Spring Term at the Drill Hall in Ware. They each perform a song of their choice and then take part in the Cantata performance which tells a story through music and narration. Overall it is a huge undertaking. Coming such a short time after our own school choir performance at the London 02, in February, the children do incredibly well to prepare. Mrs Wilson, our choir master, is the key to their success so I just wanted to say a huge thank you to her for making sure everyone was ready for the performance.

## PUNCTUATLITY: 20% OF PUPILS ARRIVED LATE YESTERDAY

**School starts at 8:40am every day.** Children need to be in their class line at 8:40am so that they can start their lessons promptly. <u>Children who arrive late are greatly disadvantaged because they miss starting the day with their peers and the beginning of lessons. This means that they are often unsettled and confused <u>about tasks.</u> It is essential that you ensure your child arrives at school on time to prevent disruption to your own child's learning and that of others.</u>

### **Class 4 Chicks**

As part of our science week Class 4 took on the responsibility of raising six chicks. As you can imagine everyone was extremely excited to watch the eggs hatch. For the first 24 hours after hatching the chicks had to stay in the incubator under close observation of our nursery and reception children. The chicks were then moved to a brooder box which was heated with a warm light. The children had to ensure the chicks were fed, watered and that their box was kept clean and tidy. Obviously all of the chicks had to be given a name. My personal favourite was "Elizabeth Sparkle" ©. Throughout the two week experience I think every child, member of staff and many parents managed to manufacture a reason to visit class 4 and the chicks. It was a delightful learning experience that brought everyone together. We shall look forward to the next time.
